



Director of Music

I've been telling you for the past two months about a joint downtown concert coming up in March, and, well, it's March! In case you missed the previous notices, the Springfield Chapter of the American Guild of Organists will be sponsoring a concert presented by St. Michael's Cathedral, Christ Church Cathedral and South Congregational Church. The choirs of all three churches will join forces to present Cantata 182 by Johann Sebastian Bach as well as his well-known chorale "Jesu, Joy of Man's Desiring." Additionally, the music directors of all three churches will play organ solos. The vocal soloists will include Tabor Fisher and George Eisenhauer, both of the South Church choir, as well as Tabor's wife, Rachael Fisher. The event will happen on the afternoon of Sunday, March 24, at 4 p.m. at Christ Church Cathedral, 35 Chestnut Street. There will be no admission charge, although a free-will offering will likely be taken.



My hymn series appears to be as difficult to schedule in spite of its popularity. Two of the February sessions had to be cancelled because of church meetings after worship, so I'm thinking about a once-a-month schedule going forward. That said, plan on March 17 after church for the next session. We'll finish looking at African-American spirituals that appear in our New Century Hymnal and, if there's time, we'll sing the hymns of Irish origin in honor of St. Patrick's Day.

Then on April 28 we'll dig a little into the revisions that were made to some of our best-known hymns in the New Century Hymnal. Many of you who remember the older Pilgrim Hymnal were likely dismayed by the changes in lyrics to some beloved hymns (and probably still are). For example, many of you long-time Congregationalists will remember the hymn, "Fairest Lord Jesus." In the New Century Hymnal this hymn appears as "Beautiful Jesus." Here is a comparison of the two texts:

Fairest Lord Jesus, ruler of all nature, O thou of God and man the Son, Thee will I cherish, Thee will I honor, Thou, my soul's glory, joy, and crown. Beautiful Jesus, head of all creation. God and the blessed Mary's child. I want to love you, praise and adore you, Joy of my soul so long desired.

The changes made from the first version to the second (both translations from the original German) are to make the hymn more inclusive, particularly in regard to race and gender, and also to replace

archaic language, such as the words thee and thou. Unfortunately, as a result, the poetry sounds much weaker in the newer version. Some would argue that we can sing the word "fairest" without implying that Jesus was light-skinned, or that when we say "man" we mean "humankind." That makes a lot of assumptions about what 21st century church goers understand, especially young people and those who did not have a church experience earlier in life. So, we'll take a look at some hymns and discuss the changes while gaining clarification from the New Century Hymnal Companion.


