



Director of Music

September! Talk about a month for new beginnings. The day after Labor Day has it over New Year's Day hands down. Kids starting new grades in school, graduates starting new jobs, people thinking about the fall and holiday seasons in general...oh, sorry, this is supposed to be a music article. Well then, concert and theater venues promoting their new seasons, students starting or resuming music lessons, church choirs and ensembles meeting again – it's pretty exciting, isn't it? Here at South we mark the fall season by returning to the sanctuary for worship, complete with 50-rank organ and choir. We also look forward to special events, which, in the past have included the Halloween Concert, the December noon series and other one-time events like the three-choir Bach concert we had last spring.

So, the good news is that we will return to the sanctuary and listen to the magnificent organ and the talented choir, and in all likelihood, we will also feature noon concerts again in December. The Halloween Concert, however, is taking a hiatus for this year. Our foundation and parking lot excavation project is due to begin soon, and there is a long list of variables that prevent us from knowing whether parking will be possible for a large concert crowd around the end of October. I had an opportunity to speak directly to the owner of Kelly Construction, our contractor, and as helpful and pleasant as he always is, he couldn't predict whether or not much of the parking lot might be unavailable during the last weekend of October.

So, the Halloween Concert will return in October of 2020. Meanwhile, look for a special spring event to celebrate our gleaming new parking lot and foundation. Maybe a cabaret involving our fiercely talented singers and instrumentalists?

Meanwhile, hymn enthusiasts should mark Sunday, September 29 on their calendars for the return of our hymn sessions. This series of "classes" seems to have gained enough popularity that I'm going to give it an unofficial name: "Sing Me to Heaven - the Hymns We Love and the Hymns We Didn't Know We Could Love." For short, it will just be the "Sing Me to Heaven Hymn Series." Last spring, we were investigating hymns that were modified considerably in the New Century Hymnal. We will consider such hymns again at a future date, but for this next session I'm going to take advantage of the festival that is actually observed on September 29, especially in the Roman Catholic Church: The Feast of St. Michael and All Angels. This one will be a little more than just singing through hymns featuring angels because I have a lot to share with you, having already done presentations about angels in music during my long career as a church musician. The foundation for this presentation will be the hymn "Ye Watchers and Ye Holy Ones." We'll take it from there. I hope to see you there. I promise that if you haven't attended one of these sessions thus far, you won't be disappointed by this one. *- Larry*

STEP (Suzuki Talented Educational Partnership) wants to thank you all for another great year at South Church. From weekly STEP classes in the Music Lounge to our concerts and master classes in the Guild Room and sanctuary, we are so blessed to have use of these spaces and the wonderful pianos in them. We are also very blessed to have all the help we receive from Jackie, Larry and Jared during the year. Thank you all so much for sharing your space with STEP and supporting our mission to make our high-quality, family-centered music program accessible to families in the Greater Springfield area!

We want to thank all of you who bought tickets or made donations to our May benefit concert. We had a great audience, the concert went well, and we all enjoyed the great food afterwards. We made a little more than last year – around \$1600 – despite having fewer families in STEP. This, plus donations and the grant from the Benevolence Team helped raise our scholarship fund to almost \$3000. We really needed this boost, because STEP had requests for more funds than ever last year; our fund ended with a negative balance because STEP never turns away a family who is willing to make the commitment to study music through our program.

Thank you all, and our prayers are with all of you as you continue to discern God's call here at the corner of Maple & High St. and beyond.
