



From the Bridge Pastor

Hi South,

I'm here, your Bridge Pastor. We will start seeing more of one another in December, as Advent begins. Plan to gather on Wednesday night, December 4, for the first Advent Rejoice Night "Dinner Church," 5:30 – 7:00 pm Parish Hall. Invite friends to join – it will be an informal, but prayerful space of food, conversation, candles, song and blessing.

Advent is the cusp of beginning. It is like being in the entry hallway in a house you've never been in before, or like having decided to quit a job that was making you miserable but not yet knowing what you'll do next, or like finding yourself in totally new relationship or living situation or season of feeling either by choice or by accident or by loss; it's like being pregnant and due in 3 weeks; it's like being the



partner of someone who is pregnant and due in 3 weeks; it is being inside a space just about to begin, wonder-full and nerve-wracking at once.

Something has ended, and yet something new is not quite begun. There are signs all around of some big change coming, but in the cusp of beginning, there is still so much unknown and we are still trying to figure out where the signs are pointing, what they are saying. We know the story of Christmas well, we retell it every year, so sometimes the unknowingness of Advent gets lost.

But fear not, I hope to take us more fully into the bewilderment of Advent! This may not sound appealing – entering bewilderment. Don't we have enough of that in our lives?! Exactly *because* we have so much bewilderment in our lives, we are lucky to get to turn to the guide of Advent. The liturgical season of Advent is rich with stories for paying attention, for listening inside bewilderment, for carrying a hope in what is on the cusp of beginning, for being oriented toward the new way that is emerging but not yet begun.

"How do you live in an age of bewilderment, when the old stories have collapsed and no new story has yet emerged to replace them?" This is a question Yuval Noah Harari poses in his book, "21 Lessons for the 21st Century," which I recently read.

We live in an age of bewilderment. Old stories have collapsed, and no new story/stories have emerged yet to replace them. This is true beyond the church, and it is true of the church. And specifically, it is true of South.

Theologian Paul Tillich, writing in 1955, describes something about Christianity which is very much connected to the bewilderment we are feeling now and the challenge of discerning a way into the new being: "Christianity is more than a religion; it is the message of a new

Creation...Christianity is the message of the New Creation, the New Being, the New Reality which has appeared with the appearance of Jesus who for this reason, and just for this reason, is called the Christ. For the Christ, the Messiah, the selected and anointed one is They who bring the new state of things."

We are lucky to have good guides in the stories of this faith we are intrigued, named, claimed by.

A Parking Lot Update

The front parking lot is scheduled to be paved with a binder coat before Thanksgiving, after which it will be open for parking. The parking lot entrance off Maple Street will remain closed through the end of construction next spring. Three lot entrances will be open on Temple Street - the entrance currently in use to the rear parking area and two new Temple Street entrances to the front parking area. The front parking area will not have parking lines at this time. Please be thoughtful about where you place your car. The Guild Room door will be accessible. The granite steps into the Guild Room have been repaired.

On Tuesday, December 3 through Thursday, December 5, the kitchen and back entryway will be closed. Many construction activities will occur concurrently. The kitchen will reopen on Friday morning and there should not be further impact to kitchen activities. The entryway will also reopen on Friday morning. Each Wednesday after that the entryway will be closed for the day until that construction is completed. While the entryway is closed access to the buzzer at this entrance will also be closed. Arrangements for those needing entrance need to be made with church staff. The Guild Room door will be accessible on Wednesdays for entrance to Prayer Shawl, Noon Concerts and Rejoice Night activities.

Before I forget, in the November issue I implied that the Tuba Christmas event which would have happened on December 8, might be relocated because of our parking lot project. In fact, the Tuba Christmas people did decide to play it safe and that concert has been moved to the Mount Tom Masonic Hall, 235 Chestnut Street, Holyoke. We hope to host them again at South Church in 2020!



Also take note that our Christmas Eve service this year will happen at **4 p.m.**, not 5:30 p.m. as has been the case in the past. It is always a great service for hearing great music, so arrive a little early to enjoy some beautiful prelude music.

However, if you just can't wait until December 24 and you happen to be free on Wednesdays between noon and 1 p.m., join us for the annual South Church noon

concerts, this year happening on December 4, 11 and 18. **While construction is happening on our back entryway, come into the building through the Guild Room door.** Here's the lineup:

- **December 4:** Larry Picard will play holiday works for organ, piano, organ and piano together (assisted by Susan Wells of our choir), handbells and guitar together (with Meg Pash on guitar).
- **December 11:** Our choir basses, Carey Lape and Tabor Fisher, will sing solos and duets, and I will even join them for a few a cappella trios (think The Three Tenors, but with much lower voices). They can make quite a powerful sound, so don't sit too close.
- **December 18:** I really like this one, which features our own Jayne Newirth and George David. It will feature a few entertaining holiday readings by Jayne as well as two or three songs sung by her (unless we can cajole her to sing more) and as many sax solos by George.

Sound like fun? Join us on these three Wednesdays at noon in the sanctuary. There is no admission charge but I'm always happy to have you drop a little cash into the offering plates near the doors.

Meanwhile, you all may remember our first-ever brown bag pageant on the Sunday before Christmas last year. South Church members learned of their roles as they walked in the door last year, and everyone in the sanctuary got in on the act when it was time for the angels to appear. - *Larry*
