#### From the Moderator

#### **Building from the Inside-Out**

"For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart"

What has your time spent with the word of God in prayer revealed to you about South Church? Where have you felt the Spirit active in your meditations? What prayers, ideas and thoughts will you bring to our next Discernment Session?

**Please mark your calendars**. Beverly Prestwood-Taylor returns to South Church on **Sunday, November 10** to preach and guide us in another opportunity to pray, listen, share and envision something new for South Church.

In our first discernment session, we learned *how* to discern. To use a set of actions and ways of communicating that allow us to listen and prayerfully respond to the movement of Spirit. We shared hopes and dreams for the future of South Church. And, we left that afternoon feeling hopeful. At least I did!

Since that September afternoon, we've continued to discern and listen for God's voice. We made a difficult decision about the funding for the parking lot. As I write, the "joints and marrow" of our beloved building are undergoing transformation. Soon, a stronger foundation, an accessible entrance and new front steps and a smooth surface for our vehicles will emerge from the rubble outside. Sure, it's messy. Of course, it costs more than we'd like. And despite this, we said YES because we believe a transformation is also happening inside, in our spirits



and in our vision of what South will be in the near and distant future.

#### **4 HOPES** came from our first session:

- 1. **RESOURCES:** We want to work together to find creative ways to develop more resources to support our ministries.
- 2. **OUTREACH:** We want to reach out in meaningful, Christ-centered ways to our neighbors and others who need our support, both near and far. We believe that vital outreach will also grow our church.
- 3. **SPIRITUAL COMMUNITY:** We want to grow the Spirit of God in us and in our corporate community (this means as the faith family of South), which will bring us together and help us reach others.
- **4. MUSIC:** We want to continue to be inspired by the music of the church, and to use it to reach out to the community.

Join me in taking the next step on **Sunday, November 10 following the worship service**. Beverly will "coach" us through deciding which of these **4 HOPES** we will "discern" on. We will work together through the process, using the actions she taught us in September as a way to instill the confidence that we may continue this work *without* her.

Until then, pray daily for South. Pray the "Weekly Prayer for South." (Prayer from October 27 below) Listen to what you hear. Gather these words from the Spirit. And bring your "thoughts and intentions of the heart" to this day. These are the "joints and marrow" of South, the materials God will work with to lead us in building, from the inside-out.

Dr. James Gordon Gilkey in the South Church pulpit. As it happened, my sister

Kathie and I had tickets to the Springfield Preservation Trust annual Cemetery Tour, which this year was held at Springfield cemetery. If you haven't experienced this event yet it is well worth it. Actors in period costume stand by the grave of the person they are portraying and tell about their life. Well, as we stood listening at the second grave I happened to look over and there it was, about twenty feet away: the grave of Dr. Gilkey! Fortunately, he seemed to rest in peace in spite of whatever I may have said about him that morning.





So, with the time of spookiness behind us (despite the absence of the Halloween concert this year) we look forward to the Holiday season. As promised, the Wednesday noon concerts will happen in December even if we have only half a parking lot. Here is the lineup:

- **December 4:** I will be playing my annual recital of holiday works for organ and piano, and maybe I'll throw in another handbell solo. I always aim to astonish and delight.
- **December 11:** Our choir basses, Carey Lape and Tabor Fisher, will sing solos and duets, and I will even join them for a few a cappella trios (think The Three Tenors). They can make quite a powerful sound, so don't sit too close.
- **December 18:** I really like this one, which features our own Jayne Newirth and George David. It will feature a few entertaining holiday readings by Jayne as well as two or three songs sung by her (unless we can cajole her to sing more) and as many sax solos by George.

Join us on these three Wednesdays at noon in the sanctuary. *Meanwhile, take note:* as of this writing, the annual Tuba Christmas event will happen here at South on December 7 at 2 p.m. That said, we are keeping an eye on the parking lot reconstruction. If it appears the work will not be done in time, the concert may be relocated. More as it happens!

Meanwhile, the hymn series will continue on November 17. I'm still mulling over a few ideas about a theme but I'm sure Thanksgiving and Advent will play into it somehow. Stay tuned for a date for the Christmas hymn session, although it may have to wait until after the New Year, depending on what's happening.
